

SEA WEEK BEACH CLEAN UP

Kelly Tarlton's Sea Life Aquarium organised a beach clean-up at Mission Bay Beach for Sea Week. Originally, the clean-up on Saturday March 4th, was just for Mission Bay. However, due to the significant numbers of students from all year levels at BDSC who attended, students were separated into two groups, with the second group venturing to Okahu Bay while the rest stayed at Mission Bay.

When we arrived we were given gloves to wear and a bag to put rubbish in. We scoured the beaches for rubbish, keeping a tally of the amount of plastic, cigarette butts and bottle caps we collected.

Surprisingly, Okahu Bay was quite clean, with rubbish mostly being cigarette butts and small bits of plastic. However, Mission Bay was significantly dirtier, littered with food wrappers and plastic from the nearby shops. Plastic was the biggest pollutant on the two beaches.

Rubbish in Mission Bay can make its way out to sea. This was a major factor in deciding to participate in this clean-up: the chance to reduce this happening. Participating in the clean- up made people more aware of the rubbish that they leave behind, which was especially fitting as it was Sea Week.

The weather was pleasant for the most part, with the sun shining and a gentle breeze drifting across the beach. The clean-up lasted from 10am to 12pm and left the beach much cleaner than when we first arrived. At the end of the event, we had collected almost 20 Kg's of rubbish.

After the clean-up we were given free tickets to Kelly Tarlton's, which of course was a huge plus. We are extremely grateful to all the students and parents that came along and we definitely look forward to more people coming to the next beach clean-up.





NEW ZEALAND ALL BLACK SEVENS-TONE NG SHIU

BDSC has seen some real depth and talent emerge from our proud school and Tone emulates that to the nth degree. His early accomplishments as a 'rugby head' started in 2010 in his first year of 1st XV for Botany and later selected for Auckland U16's. His passion for the school and rugby continued and in Y12 was selected as the 1st XV captain. He lead this squad as winners in the 1B Plate final. In this same year he was named Vice Captain for the Auckland U18's divisional Squad. He became an inspiration to the younger team members and showed great leadership and dedication.

Since Tone's graduation from BDSC in 2012 his career highlights show that he is set off on a course for great success.

In 2013 aged 18 he was the youngest player selected to join our local Pakuranga Premier team. The team went onto win the club's first title by capturing the coveted 'The Gallaher Shield'. Tone set on his path again to play 7's for his club and after a successful tournament was invited to compete in the South Island Canterbury Club 7's tournament. At this tournament he impressed many around him and was offered a contract to play rugby in Nelson and be part of the Crusaders Academy. Tone debuted for the Tasman Mako's ITM cup in 2015 and gained 3 more club premier titles with 'The Wanderers' and has been a regular on the 7's fixture.

In 2017 to top off his array of accomplishments, after a successful South 7s qualifier and National 7s tournament his natural ability and talent was again recognised. Tone was offered not 1 but 2 opportunities. Tone was torn between the pride of his beloved home country and the dream of almost every child to play in the black jersey. After declining a selection from one of the country's best 7s coach Sir Gordan Tietjens and his beloved country Samoa he joined the NZ All black 7's where we have seen his bursts of talent emerge on the field.

Along with BDSC staff and students past and present, and as one of his excoaches we are very proud of all that he has achieved. We now sit and watch to see where this talented player, outstanding and genuine young man will land. He has already accomplished so much and we can't wait to watch this space.....
