International Homestay Application



Thank you for your inquiry regarding becoming a residential caregiver for a Botany Downs Secondary College.

We understand that it is not always easy to make the decision to take an international student into your home; we hope that the enclosed information will help you to make a decision. We try to match students to families with similar interests; the information you provide to us helps us in this process.

International students come to NZ to improve their English and experience New Zealand culture. For this reason, it can be very difficult to place students with immigrant families or families for whom English is a second language. If you are an immigrant family, and your first language is not English, we are happy to keep your details on file, but may not be able to place students with you.

If you decide to apply, please complete the application form and return it to the school. All adults (18 and over) living in the home must complete a consent form for vetting by the Police; which will be reviewed before approval.

Please also pass the referee forms to two appropriate people (i.e. current employer) to act as referees and ask them to complete the forms and return them directly to the College. All information provided is treated in the strictest confidence.

When we have received all the required information we will contact you to arrange a home visit if your application is approved, we will keep your information on file and contact you if a suitable student applies to the school.

The homestay fee is \$310.00 per week, payable by automatic payment on a weekly basis in advance by the school.

Becoming a Caregiver

A Homestay is an arrangement where overseas students are given the opportunity of being accepted as a member of a New Zealand family. Homestay accommodation is NOT the same as staying in a hotel or as a 'guest'. With support from the school, caregivers are expected to assume the role of substitute parents. This means making decisions about acceptable behavior and the enforcement of limits. Students should be treated as another member of the family with the same rights and restrictions as any teenager.

MEALS

- Please provide three nutritious meals per day generally the same meals your family eats. If students are away for a meal please provide an alternative (i.e. packed lunch or no more than \$10 per meal).
- Please have a supply of rice and/or noodles available for Asian students.

ACCOMMODATION & LAUNDRY

Students can reasonably expect that:

- Their laundry will be done on their behalf
- They will have room and bed of their own including clean pillows and bed linen
- They will have a study desk and lamp (or adequate lighting) so they can study in comfort
- They will have adequate heating and bedding in winter
- They will have sufficient storage for their clothing, books and other belongings

TRANSPORT TO SCHOOL

- Students may walk if their accommodation is close to school. It is important to ensure that students are confident of the route before they go to school alone.
- Transport may also be by bike, car or by bus. If using a bus, you should make sure that students know which bus to catch, where to get on and off, and how to purchase a ticket.

GENERAL

- A key attendance requirement is that caregivers are aware of student's whereabouts at all times. Guidelines for this can be found in the residential caregiver reference book.
- It's important to help and encourage students to speak English and participate in family activities.
- Caregivers are responsible for getting students to school on time. This may involve getting students out of bed in the morning!
- Tell your student the most convenient time to have a bath or shower and the maximum time to use the shower (no more than 10min).
- Students are expected to obey curfews set by caregivers and recommended times can be found in our residential caregiver reference book.
- Students should be expected to keep their own room clean and tidy, and to participate in household chores within reason.
- It is important that caregivers take an interest in the education of the student and are expected to attend meetings
 regarding student's academic progress. If you feel that your student is not doing as much work as they should or
 alternatively working harder than they should please get in touch with the school.

SUPPORT

- Your Homestay Co-ordinator should be contacted if there are any concerns about student behavior.
- Occasionally some placements do not work out. Moves can be arranged if either the caregiver or the student becomes unhappy and feel that an issue cannot be resolved. Two weeks is generally required to allow time to source an alternate accommodation and complete administrative processes.

SUPERVISION

- Students under 14 years old cannot be left at home alone without making a reasonable arrangement for their supervision.
- Regardless of their age international students must never be left overnight without the supervision of the designated primary caregiver(s).
- In order to protect caregivers from accusations, steps should be taken to avoid female students being left with only male supervision. If this is not possible contact a homestay coordinator.

INTERNET

Caregivers should provide unlimited broadband (preferably wireless). Internet access is an essential tool for students to communicate with their families and to do their schoolwork. They should be strongly discouraged from spending large amounts of time watching own-language movies or playing video games.

WHEN STUDENTS WANT TO GO OUT

Knowing student's whereabouts is a key part of the caregiver role. Always enquire where your student is going, who they will be with, what their transport arrangements are and what time they will be home.

If your student plans to stay out overnight with another BDSC Caregiver, please ask for a contact name and telephone number and confirm arrangements. Students may not stay out overnight at a venue where there is no adult supervision.

FAMILY OUTINGS

You should invite students to join you on family outings. It is generally expected that students will cover their own expenses but please make sure that this is clear and agreed beforehand to avoid misunderstandings.

HEALTH

International students will have Travel and Medical Insurance coverage before they leave their own country. When a student arrives please register them with your family doctor. This will allow for a smooth experience if they require a consultation during their stay. If their English language skills are poor, and a Doctor who speaks their language is available, this would be preferable. The student should pay the required fee themselves. Ensure that a doctor's note and receipts are kept, and a claim form can be obtained from the International Student Office.

SMOKING

All students are directed NOT to smoke/vape. It is an offence to sell nicotine/vaping products to young people aged under 18 years of age. If a student is discovered with smoking or vaping material you must advise the school.

DRINKING

All students are directed NOT to consume alcohol during their stay. It is an offence to sell alcohol to anyone under 18 years of age. If a student is discovered in possession of alcohol or you have reasonable grounds to suspect they have consumed alcohol, you must advise the school.

DRUGS

All students are directed NOT to consume illegal narcotics. If a student is taking illegal substances or you have reasonable grounds to suspect they are using narcotics, you must advise the school.

DRIVING

Students are not permitted to own a vehicle or drive while they are a student at BDSC. If you are aware or suspect the student is doing this please contact the International Student Office.

COMMUNICATION

To avoid any misunderstanding please communicate often with your student, and depending on their level of English, ask them to repeat instructions back to you. Please encourage basic manners such as table manners and the appropriate time for them to say: 'excuse me', 'please' and 'thank you'.

All communications between residential caregivers and parents should be directed through the college. Should direct communication be established, messages should only be of a positive nature if communications become in anyway negative, all communication must cease, and your co-ordinator must be informed immediately.

The college works with both overseas and on shore educational agents to recruit students. Some agents are very hands on and some simply arrange the initial school placement. It is important that messages from agents are relayed via the school. Should an agent contact you directly please refer them to an international staff member.
