

ASSESSING ACHIEVEMENT LEVELS OF MĀORI & PASIFIKA STUDENTS POLICY

Rationale:

The Botany Downs Secondary College School Board recognises the need to improve the achievement of Māori & Pasifika students to enable them to have equitable access to future educational, occupational and social opportunities. The Board has an obligation under NELP to consult with the Māori & Pasifika communities, to develop and make known to the whole community policies, plans and targets for improving the achievement of these students.

Purpose:

- 1. To ensure the vision of the college is maintained and enhanced.
- 2. To comply with Treaty of Waitangi obligations.
- 3. To implement procedures for optimising achievement of Māori & Pasifika students.
- 4. To obtain the support of the college community in the implementation of these plans.
- 5. To assist staff in meeting the college's aim and obligations.

Guidelines:

- 1. Consultation with our Māori & Pasifika communities will occur annually and be reported to the Board.
- 2. The Board will encourage a Māori or Pasifika community representative to stand for the board.
- 3. The Principal and teachers will identify Māori & Pasifika students, their age, academic progress and any issues affecting both individual and collective achievement.
- 4. The Principal, in consultation with staff (in particular Māori & Pasifika teachers) with appropriate community agencies and with local Māori, will develop a programme of interventions, activities and resourcing aimed at improving achievement levels, for consideration by the Board. This may involve targeted funding, procurement of appropriate resources and possible appointment of staff.
- 5. Ongoing monitoring of Māori & Pasifika students will be maintained for attendance, literacy, numeracy and NCEA levels and reported annually to the Board.
- 6. Progress on Māori & Pasifika achievement will form part of the college's annual report to the community.
- 7. The Principal will ensure that teaching staff meet the appropriate teaching standards relating to Te Reo Māori and Tikanga Māori.

Assessing Achievement Levels of Māori & Pasifika Procedures:

- 1. A schedule is established.
- 2. The Principal and School Board will consult with the appropriate member of iwi and local community as identified in the strategic and annual plan.
- 3. Identification of Māori & Pasifika students is achievable using our KAMAR Student Management System.
- 4. Assigned Deputy Principals will collate achievement data from our tracking processes.
- 5. Annual Report submitted to School Board outlines annual results and recommendations.
