ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

A place to learn and grow

Botany Downs Secondary College is a public, co-educational high school. We have 1,800 students from 13-18 years old (Years 9-13) and we host around 100 international students from 16 countries across Asia, Europe, and Latin America. Our school has a reputation for innovation, quality of education, and a genuine commitment to individual student support.

OUR FACILITIES | A modern student-centric campus

The college opened in 2004 and was designed specifically to meet the needs of modern learning and teaching.

Science & Technology: We have a range of purpose-built science labs, as well as metal and woodworking workshops, and a commercial kitchen for Food Technology.

Arts: Our Performing Arts Centre (PAC) is an auditorium that hosts dance, drama, musical concerts, student assemblies, and prizegiving ceremonies. The school also has specialised teaching staff in the fields of Dance, Drama and Theatre, Music, Visual Art, Art History, Design and Photography.

Sports: We have two gymnasiums, a large playing field, and covered courts with a professional surface for basketball, netball, tennis, and other racquet sports. Students can take part in a wide range of sports throughout the year. (See more on the 'Co-Curricular' page.)

Health Centre: The school has a registered nurse on site daily during school hours and counselling services available. The Health Centre offers culturally sensitive, supportive and professional medical care and education to all students.

School Café: An on-site café offers a wide range of healthy options for hot food, sandwiches, snacks and drinks.

OUR WHĀNAU | The best of both worlds

A system of six school 'houses' within Botany Downs Secondary College means we can offer the support, care and community of a small school alongside the benefits that come with a larger campus, such as more subject choices, facilities and co-curricular activities. We call this our Whānau system.

'Whānau' is the Māori word for 'family' (pronounced 'FAR-no'). Each Whānau house has its own building containing specialist teaching rooms and common areas with lockers, kitchen facilities and break spaces. Teachers assigned to the different Whānau make sure that students' needs are well looked after. These Whānau buildings give students a 'home' during the school day and are an important part of life at our college. (See more on the 'School Life' page.)

OUR LOCATION | Everything you need close by

Our college is in Botany Downs, a suburb of Auckland 40 minutes from the CBD. Botany Downs is an affluent area developed in the early 2000s and is where most of our homestay families live. It is a safe, neighbourly environment with playing fields, parks, and gym facilities.

Directly opposite the school is Botany Town Centre, one of New Zealand's largest shopping malls, which also offers a library, cinema, food court, skating rink, and ten pin bowling. This is a popular place for students to meet their friends and provides great shopping and entertainment within the Botany Downs area.

A local bus hub gives students easy access to Auckland CBD if needed, and Botany Downs is also close to Auckland International Airport, meaning students have only a short trip from the airport to their new homestays.





LIVING IN NEW ZEALAND

Accommodation to suit you

There are three residential options for international students wishing to study at Botany Downs Secondary College.

- Parent: living with a parent who may apply for a Guardian Visa in New Zealand.
- Designated Caregiver: living with someone known to the student's family (e.g. a relative or close family friend).
- **Homestay Family:** living with an approved Homestay Family arranged and overseen by our International Student team at Botany Downs Secondary College.

Additional fees apply for Homestay Family accommodation. (See the 'Fees' page for details.)

THE HOMESTAY EXPERIENCE | Be part of Kiwi life

Living with a New Zealand family is an important part of the international student experience as it is a chance to experience Kiwi life and improve spoken English.

Our homestay families love welcoming international students. For them, it is a chance to bring the world into their homes, to meet new people and to learn more about their way of life too!

We have a wide range of homestay families, from professional couples with young children to families with their own children at Botany Downs Secondary College, and older couples with no children living at home.

Our homestay families live in and around the Botany Downs area, where the school is located. Most live in modern homes and are only a short walk or drive from the school. You can be confident that your child will be in a home that is clean and safe, and with people who will care for them and help them to get the most out of their New Zealand experience.

We understand how important it is that students are placed with a family that is the most suitable for them. When making placements, our homestay coordinators carefully consider the best match for your child's needs. When applying, students can tell us about themselves and their interests, as well as any other information that could be important when assigning a homestay family.

Our homestay coordinators visit host families at least twice a year to make sure students are happy and cared for, and they also meet with students individually at least twice a year.

STUDENT SUPPORT

Here to help

We prioritise quality care and support of our international students. Students can always access our friendly International Student support team, who work on site at the school.

Our International Student Office operates an "open door" policy where we are available for students every day to help meet their needs. It is important that all international students have a place to go for support and information, and our International Student Office is an environment where students can come and feel comfortable and welcome.







STUDYING AT BOTANY DOWNS SECONDARY COLLEGE

Love learning, love life

Botany Downs Secondary College delivers outstanding academic results, surpassing the national averages for coeducational schools in New Zealand. We have particular strengths in Mathematics, Science, and Technology, where our Year 13 students consistently achieve Scholarship Awards, which recognise the top 3% of New Zealand students.

Our professional teaching staff work closely with all our students. We have a comprehensive mentoring system that will help us ensure your child is achieving to the best of their ability and is well- supported in meeting their academic goals. We have dedicated English support classes and after-school help for some subjects. We monitor students' results throughout the year and provide help where necessary.

You can see your child's progress at school using the Parent Portal on our website. This lets you view your child's subject results, attendance and much more.

ACADEMIC CURRICULUM | Building strengths and aspirations

All international students are part of the same academic programme as other students in the college, so have the same opportunities as New Zealand students (although additional fees may apply) and are taught side-by-side with Kiwi kids.

Students in New Zealand are divided into Year groups, based on age. The approximate ages for each year level are:

Botany Downs Secondary College teaches the national curriculum created by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA), as do most secondary schools throughout New Zealand.

Within this, students in Years 10-13 can choose from a range of subjects across English and Arts, Maths and Sciences, Social Sciences, Business, Languages, and Technology.

The opportunity to choose subjects may be a different experience for students from countries where their curriculum is set. The New Zealand system of choosing subjects is a chance for more in-depth learning, and to tailor a student's study to their particular career goal.

In Years 9, 10, and 11, students take part in assessments throughout the year. In Years 12 and 13, students work towards achieving New Zealand's National Qualification, known as NCEA (National Certificate of Educational Achievement). This qualification is used by New Zealand universities and other tertiary institutions (in New Zealand and internationally) for admission selection.

NCEA | Innovation in the pursuit of excellence

Students in Years 12 and 13 work towards NCEA Level 2 and 3. To achieve a Level, a student must earn credits across their subjects. Schools use a variety of assessments to measure how well students meet these standards. When they achieve a standard, they gain credits.

USING NCEA OVERSEAS | Learning that travels with you

Several international agreements ensure New Zealand's NCEA results are understood and accepted overseas. The New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) is recognised in the European Union (including Britain and Germany), Australia, Thailand, and India.

We also have extensive experience in working with students from Latin American countries and can arrange con-validation of NCEA qualifications.

Wherever you come from, we can work with your country's education system to have your child's study time and qualifications recognised. The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is also available to students wishing to become accredited.



THE ACADEMIC YEAR

Ready when you are

The New Zealand academic year starts in February and ends in early December.

International students can join the school at any time during the year, but starting in February gives them access to the full range of subjects, clubs, and sporting opportunities that we offer.

The school year is divided into four terms of 10 weeks each, with school holiday periods of two weeks between each term. These holidays occur in April, July, and late September-early October.

NCEA students (Years 12 and 13) have exams at the end of the year, starting in November. The number of exams a student has and when their final exam will be varies, based on the subjects your child has chosen.

WHĀNAU | The best of both worlds

Our Whānau system is at the heart of the college and the foundation of our comprehensive approach to student education and care

Every student is assigned to one of six Whānau 'houses' when they start at Botany Downs Secondary School. Each Whānau house has its own building, overseen by a lead teacher. The Whānau buildings contain specialist teaching rooms, a kitchen, commons area, and students' lockers.

The commons area is a relaxed space where students can gather before and after school, as well as during breaks in the day. It is also the venue for weekly Whānau assemblies where student successes are celebrated, and important matters are communicated. The kitchens have microwave ovens, boiling water, and sandwich presses so students can bring meals from home to heat up at lunchtime.

Our Whānau houses let us offer the support, care, and community you'd find in a smaller school alongside the benefits that come with a larger campus, such as more subject choices, facilities and co-curricular activities.

International students who speak the same language are spread evenly between the six Whānau as this gives them the best opportunity to integrate with local students.

UNIFORM | Creating a feeling of belonging

All students at Botany Downs wear the school uniform, with different styles for the Junior and Senior schools. We are proud of the positive reputation the school enjoys in the community and the presentation of our students contributes to this.

All uniform items (except for shoes) can be bought from the school's on-site uniform shop when students arrive.

International students will be provided with a basic stationery pack on arrival. Some subjects will have additional specific stationery requirements that students may have to purchase.

All students need to bring their own laptop to school each day to support their learning. Tablets are not suitable. High-speed WiFi is available throughout the school.

We have a partnership with Microsoft that allows students to install the Microsoft Office suite free of charge (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, etc).

SPORT, ARTS & CULTURAL ACTIVITIES | Discover your passion

We believe that being active, being involved, and being challenged is an important part of being a "Kiwi kid". Learning doesn't only happen inside the classroom, so we really encourage students to take part in our extensive co-curricular programme. APPLICATION PROCESS

Step 1:

Apply online via our website at www.bdsc.school.nz/international/apply-to-study

You will need to provide scanned copies of:

- your passport (and visa if you have one)
- your most recent school report (in English)
- a photo of yourself (school photo, passport photo or similar)

Step 2:

Decision on Application

Once your online application has been received and reviewed, you will be notified of next steps within 48 hours.

Step 3:

Conditional Offer of Place

If your application is successful, you will be sent a Conditional Offer of Place and an invoice will be issued.

This Offer can be used to begin your visa application process (if required).

Step 4:

Payment and Offer of Place

Once payment has been received, we will issue a receipt and an Offer of Place.

This can be used to finalise your visa application process (if required).

Step 5: Flight Details

Homestay accommodation is arranged after we receive your flight arrival information. Please send this to us as soon as possible. We recommend students purchasing flexible flight tickets*.

Step 6: Host Family Allocated

You will receive details of your New Zealand Homestay Family. Where possible, your Homestay Family will meet you at Auckland International Airport when you arrive, or the school will arrange a transfer from the airport to their home.
